Spring Show

Our Spring Show on March 28th and 29th, the MAOC Spring Show by the way, like you didn't know that, will be here before we know it. Maybe sooner than that. Yowch! We are expecting a great show. If you are interested in doing your own exhibit, and you know you are...or we would at least like you to take a shot at it, please go to the web site and fill out the exhibit reservation form, or whatever else we are currently calling it, your good, you will figure it out, and send it to Nancy Wagener via e-mail to rwagener@wowway.com. There will be a COOS display as always, so...if you aren't doing your own display, please feel free to bring your plants to help the COOS display be the biggest and best in the show, and you know we get serious competition from some other Ohio societies.

Please be sure to prepare your plants by staking the flowers, making sure the leaves are clean and the plants are bug free. Putting your name on the pots will help make sure your plants get back to you and not to me, though I will claim orphaned plants. Plants can be dropped off during the registration hours on Friday. Remember, the show is at the Airport Marriott this year and not at FPC.

Here are some of the areas where we will need help (read volunteers) in pulling off the show this year.

Set-up Thursday day and evening – This is very easy and just involves unloading and storing plants that are being delivered for exhibitors and perhaps a little set up in the exhibit rooms.

Host/Hostess – This involves walking around and helping out where ever needed; giving vendors a break if they need it; answering questions; and keeping an eye on the exhibits to be sure no one walks off with plants or disturbs the displays. Ideally, we should have two people around at all times.

Hospitality — We provide food and beverages for the hard-working judges, clerks, and vendors. Everyone in the society should try to bring in covered dishes. We will use this to feed the judges for the Judges' Luncheon on Saturday. In addition to bringing in food, both days, we also will need people to help tend the hospitality room.

Set-up Friday day or evening – This is where we can use lots of people. We will be helping exhibitors (societies and vendors) bring in their plants; help direct them to their display and sales areas; and provide general assistance to help get the show set-up.

Plant Registration – Though Tom has his volunteers, there are always a few things that need doing and the folks at the computers can't run off to do them or registration won't get done till way too late.

Clerking — This is a great opportunity to learn more about how orchids are judged. Each group of judges will be teamed with a group of clerks to assist in ribbon judging. Ideally, we should have 3 or 4 clerks per team. There will be a head clerk (typically someone who is more experienced and has clerked before), a ribbon clerk (to get judges to sign the ribbons and to place the ribbons with the awarded plants) and a spotter (to work ahead of the judging team, spotting the next plants to be judged).

Teardown Sunday Evening – We will need to help the exhibitors collect their things and clean-up after the show.

As you can see, there are any number of ways you might help make this a successful event. We will have more sign-up sheets at the February and March meetings, prior to the show. If you haven't volunteered before, please consider helping out – it's a lot of fun.


This and That
