Acanthephippium mantinianum -

Now there's a mouthful! This fascinating plant was one of many unusual orchids for sale at our June show. *Acanthephippium* is a genus of about 15 recognized species. The genus is believed to be

closely related to *Phaius*, *Calanthe*, and *Spathaglottis*. The two- to three-inch tall pseudobulbs are elongated. The thin, plicate leaves are extremely shiny, making this a very attractive plant in or out of bloom. The flowers, as shown in this photograph, are quite unusual - rich golden yellow on the exterior, strongly striped with red on the interior, the flowers are uniquely fragrant, borne on new growths and open simultaneously for the most part. The flowers present themselves upward and are shown to good effect. This is really quite an unusual plant, let alone a truly beautiful orchid.

This particular species can be grown in intermediate to slightly warm conditions in strong to medium shade. It is said this species should be repotted only infrequently. A relatively cool resting period of about a month is generally recommended. Native to the Phillippines, this species should certainly be seen in collections much more often considering its unique nature. A special thank you to the folks from Orchid Outlet for bringing this interesting plant to our attention.

DIRECTIONS TO THE HARPER'S FOR THE JULY PICNIC

- 1. Take Route 71 North past I-270 outerbelt.
- 2. Take the POLARIS PKWY exit- exit number 121.
- 3. Turn RIGHT onto POLARIS PKWY.
- 4. POLARIS PKWY becomes WORTHINGTON RD.
- 5. Stay straight to go onto POLARIS PKWY.
- 6. Turn LEFT onto OH-3/N STATE ST. Continue to follow OH-3.
- 7. Turn RIGHT onto LEWIS CENTER RD/CR-106.
- 8. Turn LEFT onto S OLD 3C HWY/CR-24.
- 9. End at 3563 S OLD 3C RD GALENA OH
- 10. (If you get to Galena, you've gone too far.)


