## President's Message

### And the envelope goes to...

Well, we won't know until October, but the wheels have started turning. The current COOS board will be ending our two-year terms December 31. The process of replacing the board begins now, with the appointment of a Nominating Committee. Per the COOS constitution in July of an election year (as this one is) the president is to appoint a Nominating Committee of at least three active members. It is the only committee of which the president can not be a member. I have tapped Jon Young, Screll Jones, and Bill Cavanaugh for this year's Nominating Committee. It is a thankless but necessary and often difficult task, as I know from my previous three turns at it.

The process, as provided in the constitution, proceeds as follows: the nominating committee presents a slate of one candidate for each officer and trustee to be elected. Only the president is forbidden to succeed himself. That slate is to be announced at the September meeting and be published in the newsletter announcing the October meeting. Additional nominations may be made from the floor during the October meeting prior to the voting. The president calls for a vote by the raising of hands. A majority of those present and voting is required for election, and the new board assumes office January 1.

Now for the hard part: finding people both willing and able to serve. Here's where YOU come in: if you are able and interested in serving please contact the members of the nominating committee. Likewise if you have suggestions as to names of those whom you think would be good candidates, contact the nominating committee.

Now is when we find out who is willing to help shoulder the work of running the society on a day-to-day basis. And that will determine who will hold the future direction of COOS in their hands.
